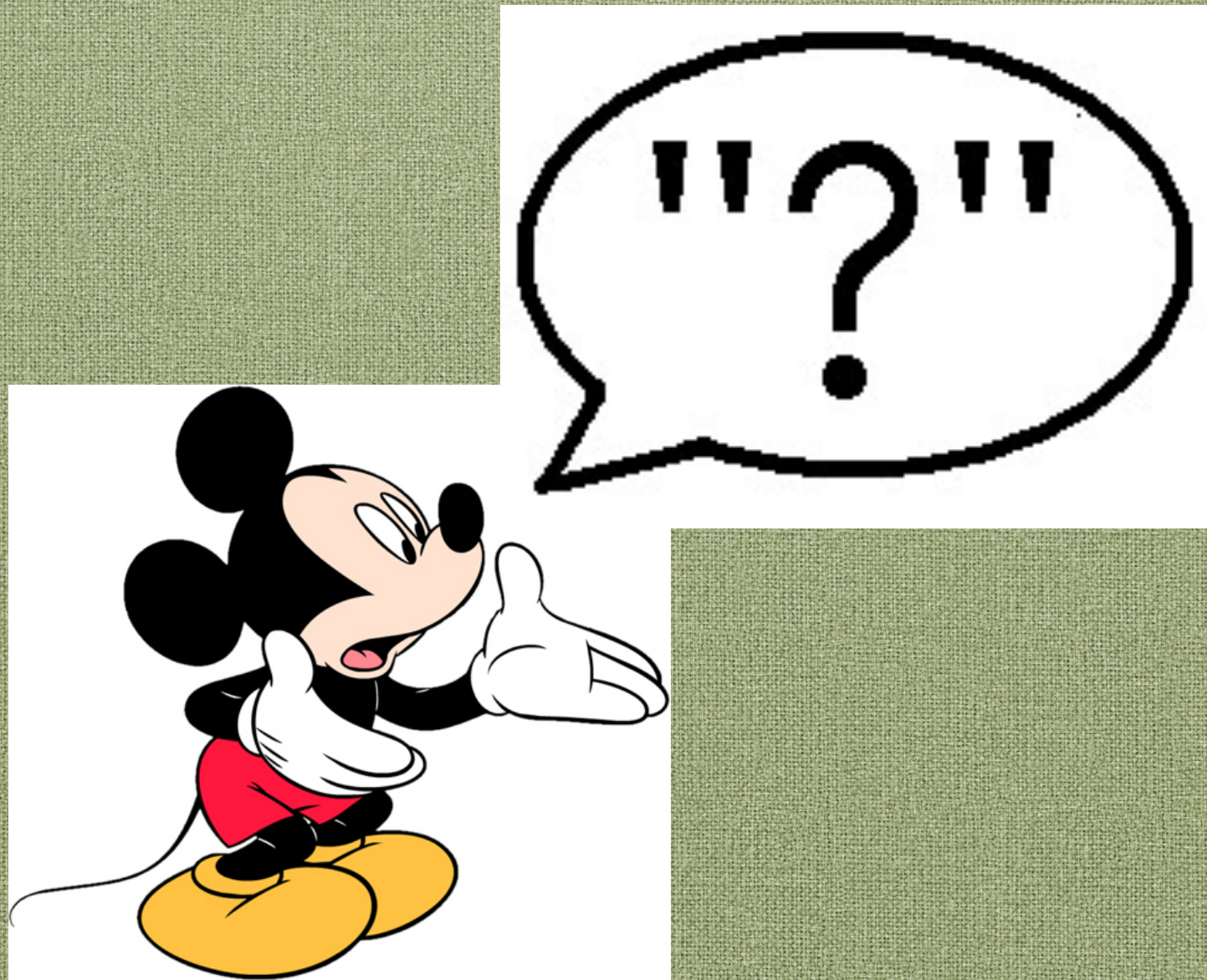

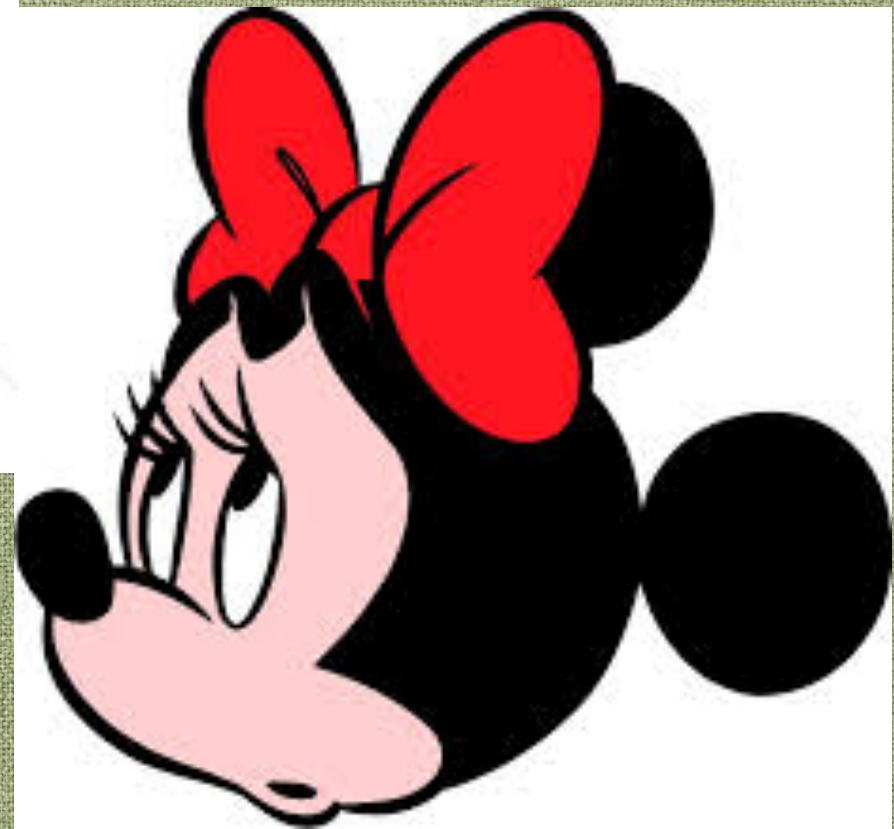


"What is Plagiarism?"



- ❖ Plagiarism is using someone else's work and calling it your own.
- ❖ **PLAGIARISM IS NOT ALLOWED!**

plagiarize?"



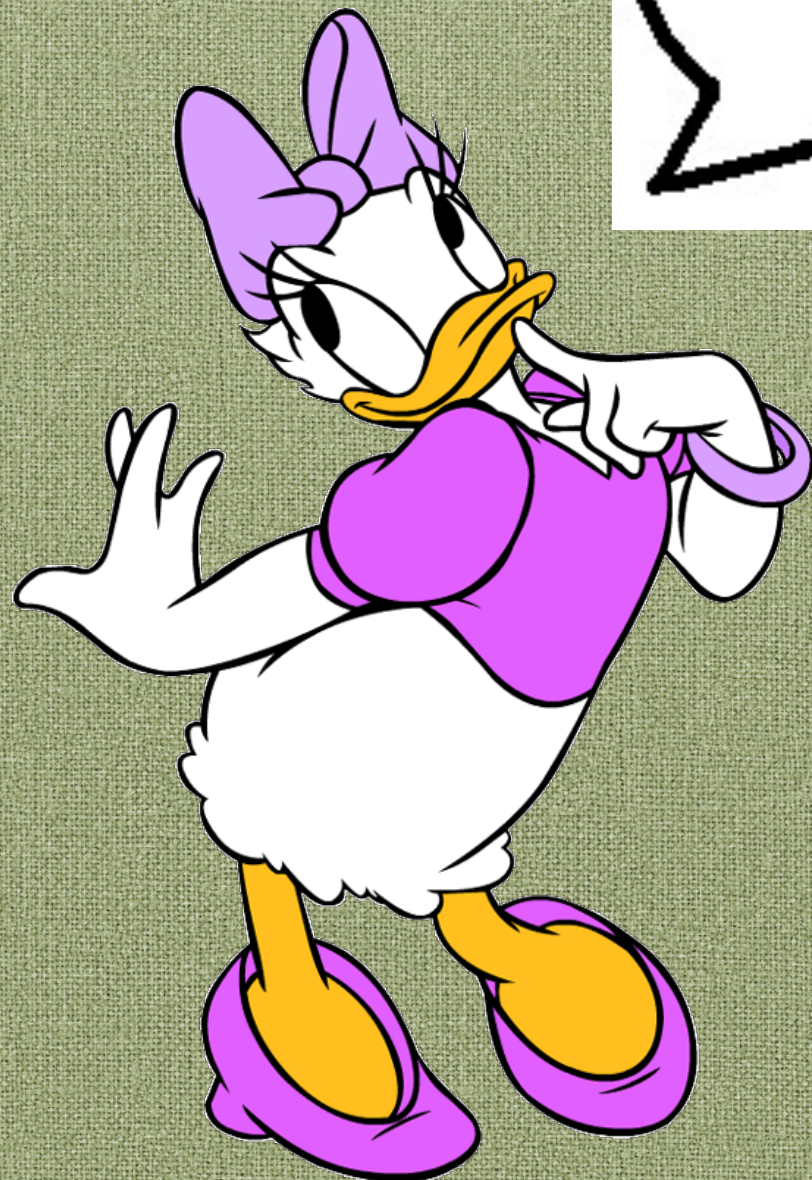
- ❖ In some schools you could get expelled or suspended.

How do I give credit?



- ❖ You can add quotation marks around the sentence you took.
- ❖ You add the website in your bibliography.

What is a bibliography?



- ❖ A bibliography is a list of website names that you used words from.
- ❖ Your bibliography has to be in alphabetical order.

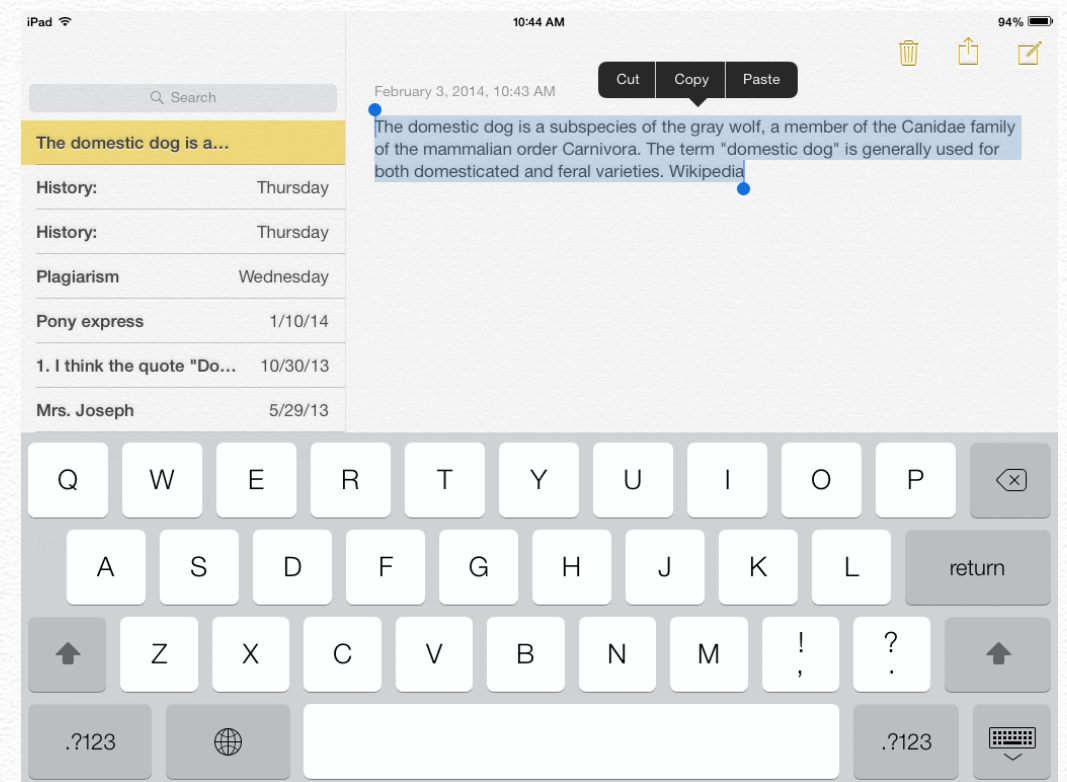
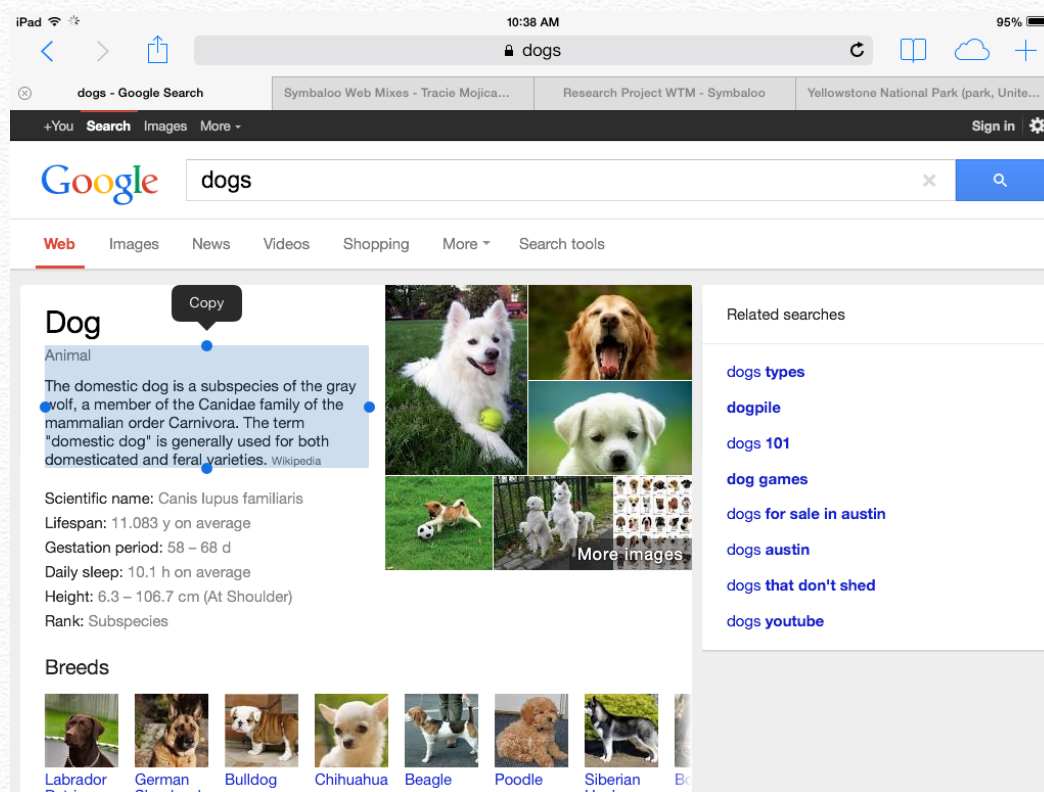
What if I really like the

- ❖ You can paraphrase the sentence.
- ❖ Paraphrasing is changing a few words in the sentence and making some of the work your own.
- ❖ You can use no more than 5 of the same words. (Not including common used words.)

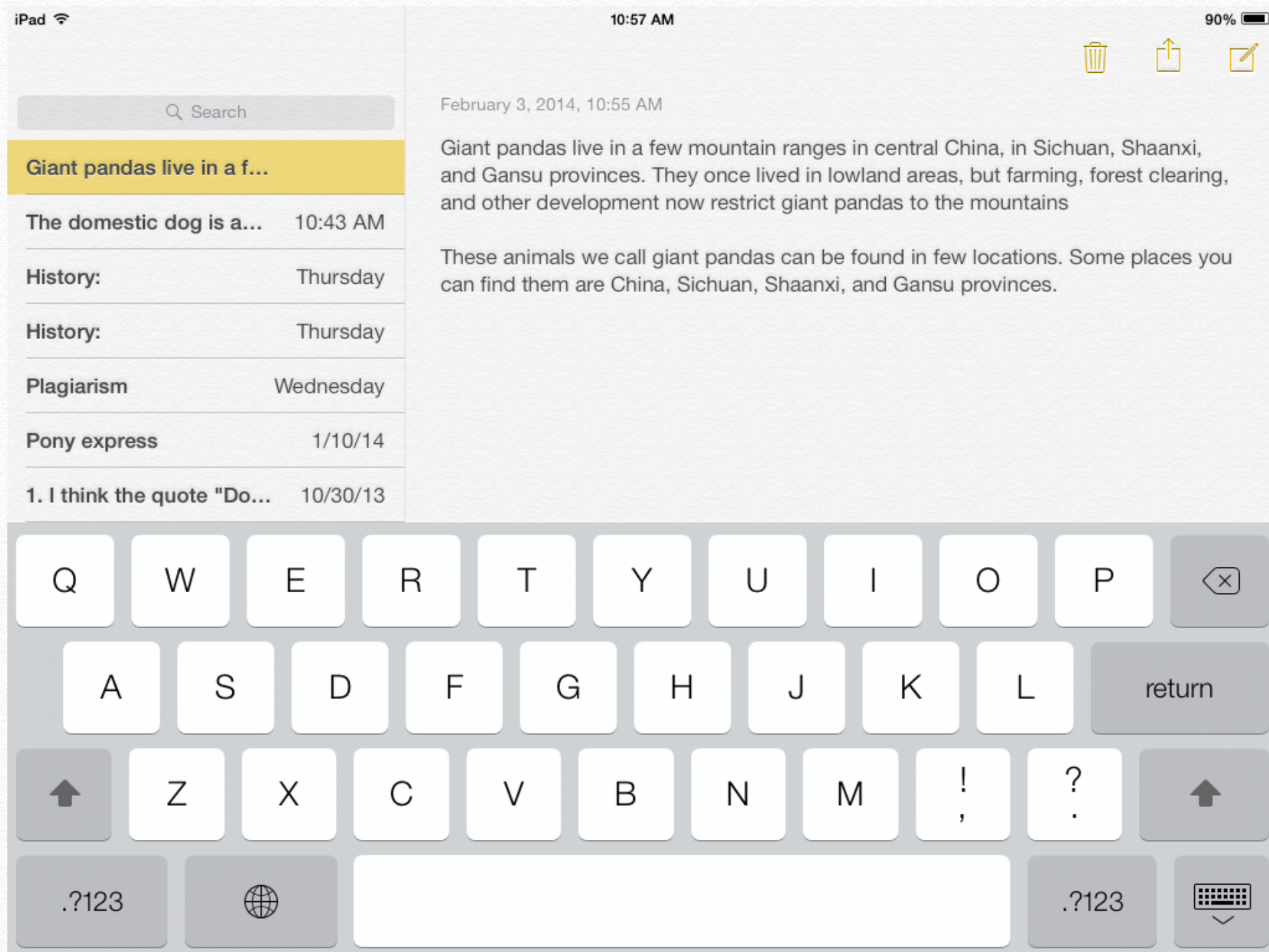

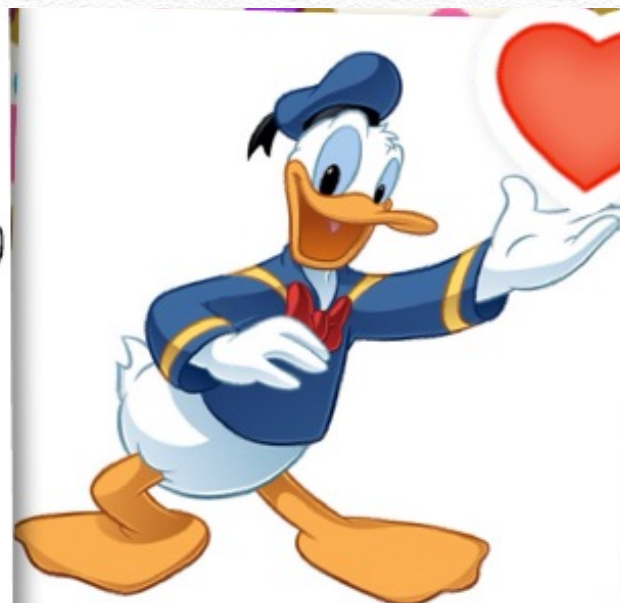
