3rd Grade Project:

17 8th graders have worked in groups and have written the text for 4 children's' books over Washington's Presidency. They have also written instructions for 3rd graders to draw pictures to illustrate their books.

I have these instructions for your 3rd graders: **We agreed that all illustrations will be done on regular computer paper turned horizontally.**

I was thinking maybe you could print this paper and cut it up to give a strip to each 3rd grader.

1. Please draw us a picture of you having fun with your friends. There should be a limit of four buddies. Also, please do not write the names of your friends on the picture.
2. Draw the flags of America, France and Britain. Then, draw two red arrows, one coming from the French flag to the American, then an arrow coming from the British flag to the American.
3. Please draw a picture of a mean king.
- 3.5 Please draw a picture of a boat.
4. Please draw a picture of two people shaking hands.
- 4.5 Please draw a big group of people attacking a king
5. Draw a French flag in the left corner. Then draw a scared person in the left corner with it . In the right corner, draw an English flag with two people attacking each other near the flag. Then draw a red arrow starting from the left and pointing at the right.
6. Please draw an American flag in the middle of the paper with three red arrows pointing out of three different sides.

7. Please Draw an American flag on the left side of the paper with one red arrow pointing to a rich person.
8. Please draw 5 kids standing on 5 other kids' shoulders.
9. Please cover the page with lollipops.
10. Please draw a parent giving a kid money.
11. Please draw a clock (you can decided what the time is)
12. Please draw 13 kids all in a horizontal line. Have a mom standing above them. Then have an arrow coming from the kids to the mom with dollar signs.
13. Please draw an angry face that covers the entire page.
14. Please draw a person with a light bulb above their head.
15. Please draw shirt and a pair of shorts and pizza with a dollar sign above.
16. Please draw a large pink piggy bank.
17. Please draw the outline of a map of the United States with a big smiley face on it. To the right of that, draw a stick figure of George Washington.
18. Please draw an outline of the U.S., and draw a frowney face on it. Then, draw a thought bubble with a stick figure drawing of George Washington in it.
19. Please draw an outline of the U.S. with the frowney face on it. To the right of that, draw a dollar bill with a big red X on it.
20. Please draw an outline of the United States with a black zigzag line through the middle going down. On top of that, draw a big red X.
21. Please draw an outline of the U.S. with a frowney face and a big black zigzag line going down through the middle.
22. Please draw a stick figure of George Washington waving goodbye.

23. Draw two people who are mad at each other.

24. Draw 1/4 of your class as an army. Then draw your whole class as one army.

25. (1) Draw a picture of a person holding a letter.

(2) Then put the words "XYZ Affair" on the letter.

(3) name the person Thomas Jefferson

(4) good job!

26. (1) draw 3 people on the left side

(2) draw 3 people on the right side

(3) draw their faces mad and like they are arguing

(4) name the right side France

(5) name the left side the US

(6) good job!

27. Dear 3rd graders, can you please draw a desk in the middle of the paper with a small sign that says John Adams. Can you also draw 5 windows above the desk, and curtains on each side of the picture. Can you also draw 2 mini figures on each side of the desk.

28. Dear 3rd graders can you draw a small flattened box in the middle of the paper. Then draw 2 stick figures on each side. Then draw about 9 other stick figures around the box. Also draw some grass by the stick figures and draw some fireworks in the sky.

I hope this is not too much to ask. The 8th graders have created books with blanks for the 3rd graders' illustrations. Let me know, if you have questions!
