




SUMMARY:

A tool that allows you to upload a single photo and then link media on top of various portions of the photo. Media can be text or a link. Links can be web articles, Google Docs, videos, websites, blogs, audio files, etc... Anything can have a link!

1. Upload photos from your computer, iPad, or web. (This step-sheet is using the web version of Thinglink: www.thinglink.com.)






2. Click on portion of the image to create a tag (this is where you link your media and add text descriptions).



3. Tag icons can be changed to showcase or highlight different elements. Remember to save your tag when you are finished editing!



- 4. Give your Thinglink a title. Modify the sharing settings accordingly. And Save.
- 5. Public images are visible to anyone. Unlisted images are only available to those you share the link with.



6. Share your image by clicking on the icon of a person to the upper left of your completed Thinglink.



7. Thinglinks can be shared via social media or email or linked/embedded in to blogs or websites. The benefit of embedding the Thinglink is that the media will all reside within your website or blog.
