


Ideas for the Classroom

- Use as part of an animal research project
- Learn more about endangered species
- Use for geography lesson
- Use as an app for **20% time in education** for students to create their own projects
- Use origami for studying 3D objects and geometric figures
- Use current news feature to learn more about endangered species around the world

- Open the App and wait for the animations to load
- Press START
- Swipe to see all of the animals available
- Choose an animal
- Press ENTER
- Instructions of how to view information will come up
- The information is laid out in a grid as if it were a foldable origami piece itself, swipe to find the information
- Each story has unique facts and a 3D globe that will actually tell you your distance from the animal's habitat (make sure location services are on for this app)
- At the end of each animal's story, or stories you have already viewed, a dog-eared page will appear at the bottom right. Here you can share the story via Facebook, Twitter, or email. In addition, you will have access to directions for an origami animal to make on your own.



- There are four options on the left
- The first one allows you to view more animals
- The second takes you to an interactive habitat globe
- The third allows you to share the stories or get origami instructions
- The fourth shares current news articles about endangered species around the world
